Remembering with Dan Gilluly...

FROM THE FILES OF DAN GILLULY:

Article in the Lancaster Eagle Gazette - 10/10/1931

L.A.C. NEWS (This was the Lancaster Athletic Club)

In a meeting at the Club House last evening, the All-Star Ten-pin League was organized. This league consists of eight teams as follows; Kiwanis Club, Johnson Dry Cleaners, Main & Maple Merchants, Gasco Transmission, Gas Field Men, Insurers, Kroger Employees and the L.A.C. This league will bowl on Monday nights, starting October 19th.

A very interesting season is anticipated with some of the best bowlers in town participating. A unique feature of the league will be the Johnson Dry Cleaners team which is composed entirely of left handed bowlers. This is believed to be the only one of its kind in the state.

It was suggested that an All-Star team be picked from the league to represent Lancaster to oppose teams that will be brought here for exhibition games from the larger cities.

In more of Dan's notes, he wrote that Lancaster hosted teams from Newark and Columbus. The games were bowled at 7:00 and 9:00 P.M. Bleachers were set up to accommodate the hundreds of spectators that attended.
