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LANCASTER ALL STAR LEAGUE



Dan Gilluly was a most amazing man. Anyone who knew Dan can verify that he had a wealth of bowling knowledge and was an amazing statistician.

Dan served as secretary of the Lancaster All Star League for over 40 years. He continued as secretary even after he could no longer bowl. He was captain of the Ricketts Excavating Team.

The statistics he kept were astounding. He kept track of every bowlers strike percentage, spare percentage, number of splits, and split conversions. He kept track of averages down to several decimal points. He did this for all bowlers, including subs, in the league not just a select few. At the

The First 200-600-650-700

The Lancaster All Star League had its inaugural on Wednesday, not Monday --- on September 28, 1938, opening Fred Corwin's new 20th Century Lanes with six teams.

Three 600 series were bowled on that first night. Tom Thimmes, bowling for Main & Maple Merchants, put together games of 182, 210 and 208 for an even 600. Two members of Pratt-Hawkinson (Logan) popped 600 sets --- Clare Johnson had 223, 204 and 181 for 608 and John Columber 612, games of 200, 218 and 194.

the first 650 score, when 197, 235 and 230 for 662. bowler, then knocked off on November 30th, when he 212 and 222 for 669 ---cause that was the night 700 score. Carl Hoffman, the first bowler to reach games of 232, 213 and 257



The next scoring milestone came the very next week --Charlie McAnespie had Johnson, an outstanding McAnespie's high score strung games of 235, but nobody knew it beof the league's first a veteran star, became the 700 plateau, with for a 702 set.



That held up for high series for the year, although alot of bowlers (Harold Behrens, 693; Dick Trimble, 684; Russ Haines, 680; even Hoffman, himself, 683) made a run at it.



The next season, Hoffman drilled a 711 (209-267-235), but that one was dwarfed by Buck Lawrence's 747 (279-277-191).

Lawrence's 747 stood up as the league's highest score for 22 years, until the 1961-62 season, when Bob Rothfuss shaded it with a 748 set.

Mickey Herman, bowling for Coca-Cola, was the league's first 200 game bowler, opening up with 206. Ralph North belted home the first 250 game two weeks later, with 254. There were a number of 250's in the following weeks: Okey Martin had three, McAnespie three, Hoffman two; other 250 bowlers were Dan Burden and Fred (Curly) Shaeffer. But Harold Behrens wiped 'em out with the first 270 game --a 278; one week later, Larry Moore came in with 278 also. That was the season's high game.

completion of each bowling season, he would compile a booklet that was available to the league bowlers full of interesting facts, each weeks team stats and each bowlers stats. He did all of this without a computer.

In addition to his fantastic record keeping, he gathered information about bowlers to be used by the local hall of fame for consideration as to whether or not a bowler was qualified.

In his day, Dan was a good bowler. He bowled against some of the best at that time. He could rattle off stories and memories of the matches he watched and that he had participated in.

Dan was an accomplished writer. He wrote articles for the "Ohio Bowler" magazine for a number of years. His ability, as a writer, was recognized when he received the Sam Levine Award from the Bowling Centers Association of Ohio. This is very prestigious accomplishment and it was well deserved.

I hope you have enjoyed this article and that it has given some insight of the man and his many talents. Believe me, we have just scratched the surface. This was Dan Gilluly. In the future, I hope to include more samples of the articles that Dan wrote and other interesting things found in Dan's records.

Let me share some information about this great organization.

The BVL, was founded in 1942 as the Bowlers Victory Legion, by a group of caring and concerned bowlers who promised "We will not forget about the sacrifices made by America's service men and women." The name was changed in 1972 to the Bowlers to Veterans Link.

BVL is a national nonprofit charity (501(c)3) which supports the neediest veterans. BVL responds to veterans in need - recuperating veterans, veterans suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and aging veterans - giving them an outlet for the joy, freedom and friendship that recreation and sport can bring. Bowlers to Veterans Link provides arts and crafts programs, music and sports activities, reading materials, board games and much more for recuperating veterans in all 172 VA hospitals.

A growing number of WWII veterans in their later years are suffering the often lonely days of long term care. Thanks to you and your donations to the BVL, these often forgotten heroes can enjoy billiards, cards and bingo or even spend their days fishing, bowling or gardening through programs at the State Veterans Homes throughout the country.


The BVL is supported and guided by the bowling industry and the nation's league bowlers. More Than 1,200 local bowling associations nationwide participate in the BVL fund-raising effort and coordinate local efforts.

The Bowlers to Veterans Link is America's only national sports organization specifically devoted to veterans with 80% of all money collected being used for the veterans, 13% for promotion and only 7% for the administration costs. BVL prides itself on one of the lowest overhead percentages while the commitment remains to insure that America's veterans are the recipients of the most funds possible.

Are you wondering what happens to the money we collect? The money we collect is donated to the BVL and then is designated to help our local veterans. The monies collected will go to the Chillicothe VA Hospital and to the local Lancaster Clinic to help with whatever our local veterans need.
