SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE PIONEER – Ron Castle

Ron began his bowling career in 1958 at the Columbus Jewish Center Lanes and was coached by his cousin and later the Lanes manager, Ethel Wiese. His first ball was a rubber red and black Ebonite, which he still has today. Ron bowled in many leagues and houses in Columbus and sometimes bowling back to back shifts. He served in the Army and after his return, he continued bowling several times a week again. Over the course of 60 years, he has won 150 league and association awards, he has six 300 games and a high series of 825 to his credit. Ron has also bowled in 34 ABC/USBC National tournaments. While he is busy running Scenic Lanes, he is very active in three leagues and still enjoys the game as much as he did at the age of 17. He is very dedicated in keeping youth involved in the sport of bowling and has been coaching them over 40 years. Ron was inducted in the YABA Hall of Fame for Meritorious Services to the Youth in 1999, along with his wife Cindy.

SUPERIOR PERFORMANCE – Becky Woltz

Becky began her bowling career early at age seven at Mt. Pleasant, which is where her mom worked and her family bowled. She has a 'back up ball' style and was once asked about stopping that, she commented 'with a 180-190 average, why would I want too!' When she hit her high average of 194, she was using a Pink White DOT, along with her back up ball style. Becky has bowled over 42 years on the Mua Wahine league with only missing a couple years, the Friday Night Mixed League for 15 years and a few other leagues at Tiki Lanes. She rolled her high series of 695 in 1990 and high game of 277 in 1993. She has bowled many local tournaments and a couple state tournaments. Becky has many accomplishments to be proud of in her 53 straight years of bowling. She was part of the team on the Mua Wahine League that set a new 5 person scratch game record of 1,054 and scratch series record 2,999; her part was a 247 and 681 respectively. In the 1998 LWBA tournament, Becky won the All Events scratch with 1,800 and in the Doubles Event with Wendy Russell; they took the prizes of Scratch game along with, Scratch and Handicap series.

Becky will also be receiving a Hall of Fame Certificate from the Ohio USBC Women's Bowling Association.

<u>PIONEER MERITORIOURS AWARD</u> – Dick Schorr

Dick was a famous personality and was from a little town in southeastern Ohio, called Logan. He began his career at the age of 19 at WHOK Radio in Lancaster and not long after, was known for his voice in various broadcasting arenas. Dick was the "Voice of the Bobcats", announcing football and basketball games play by play, for over 30 years on the OU Athens radio network. He also was heard on Mid-American Conference championship men's basketball



games, NCAA tournaments and OSU men's basketball games. Dick was the first host of the "Bowling for Dollars" TV shows and later known as "Mr. Bowling" for a few other All-Star Central Ohio bowling shows, which aired for over 20 years. Dick was inducted into the Logan High School Hall of Fame in 1978, he became a charter member in MAC Media Hall of Fame in 1996 and lastly, OU Athens Hall of Fame in 2007 for broadcasting. He retired after 31 years and was quoted, "I never worked a day in my life, because I enjoyed it so much". Dick was also an active bowler in the day, bowling at Tiki Lanes, two leagues and carried a 187 average. Continued page 2.
